Q: What email should you use?

A: If you used your school-issued email address when creating your CollegeBoard account, at this time we think **a personal email address** might be the safest option. While our tech department has included several different domains in the list of outside-network emails from CollegeBoard, we have no way of knowing from which CollegeBoard email your exam credentials will come. Our concern is that communication could be blocked if you are using your school email. We have contacted the CollegeBoard about this and are waiting for feedback.

Q: How do you check/update your email address in your CollegeBoard account?

A: Login to your CollegeBoard account [here](#) – Click on your name at the top of the page (next to the yellow symbol) – Click Account Settings (it may prompt you to verify your password) – Scroll down to **Contact Information** – Click Edit – Enter your email address – Be sure to click the box next to “Yes, please send me updates and information about CollegeBoard and CollegeBoard deadlines, dates, and related programs and services.” – Submit changes

Exam Features

- All exams are open book/open note
 - May access class notes and class resources,
 - Not permitted to incorporate work which is not the students' own
 - May not consult with other individuals during the testing period
- Most exams are 45 minutes long, one or two free response questions
 - No separate online exam for 'portfolio' courses: AP Art and Design (2D, Art 3D, Drawing), AP Computer Science Principles, AP Research, and AP Seminar
 - New submission deadline: May 26
- Use of a calculator is allowed and may be helpful - questions are designed such that required calculations can be done with a pencil and paper

May vs June Test Dates

Students are strongly encouraged to test during the May testing period. There are no exam conflicts during this period. If you encounter a technical problem during testing, you will then be able to use the June testing date. There are no further dates after the early June dates - and you won't be able to get a refund if you've already attempted testing. Give yourself a back up plan - test in MAY!

Exam Dates

- **Exam Dates:** May 11 – May 22
 - Three exams per day spaced 2 hours apart (12, 2, 4PM Eastern)
 - Each subject's exam taken on the same day at the same time, worldwide
 - Students should make plans to take their exam on a primary exam date
- **Makeup Exam Dates:** June 1 – 5
 - This is the last opportunity to take an AP Exam

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Technical Issues on Exam Day

If students encounter a technical issue during May testing, they will have an online form to complete and submit to CollegeBoard. The CollegeBoard will review and approve re-testing in June. To reduce the likelihood of an avoidable technical problem, we highly recommend that all students engage in whatever type of preparation (simulation, online videos, etc) is offered by CollegeBoard later this month.

Seniors - AP Score Reporting

You must indicate the name of the college you will be attending in your CollegeBoard account. This will ensure that your full AP score report (all tests ever) will be sent to the college you indicate. ***This must be done by June 20th.*** Many schools have come out with statements in the last week or so, confirming that they will accept the scores per the existing policy. However, you should always check with the individual institutions to confirm AP credit policies.
