Welcome to Mrs. Roy's AP Art Class!

I am so excited to be able to teach you and go through this process with you! We are going to have to work hard to get all of the requirements met! Over break I need you to purchase a good, heavy duty sketchbook, preferably spiral bound with at least 50 pages. You will complete the "31 Nights" Assignment attached. You are free to give yourself your own timeline for the sketches. You can create self-portraits or create a character for them and then follow the prompts. I would like to see process sketches and brainstorm pages, as well.

The AP® Studio Art Portfolio course is designed for students who are seriously interested in the practical experience of art and wish to develop mastery in the concept, composition, and execution of their ideas. The course teaches students how to develop their own work so that it moves beyond duplication. Plagiarism, the copy of published photographs or artwork, is not tolerated in this course. Artistic integrity and original compositions are emphasized and discussed. Your work should be based on your personal expression and own artistic vision and voice. In this course, students are required to investigate three aspects of the portfolio which include Quality, Concentration, and Breadth.

With this in mind, you have a very simple winter homework assignment. This will be for a grade and collected on Monday, August 9th. I would like you to compile a file of images. You can submit these via a google doc, powerpoint, or desktop folder. You will email me this file at Raquel.roy@maryville-schools.org. The compilation should be comprised of photos that YOU TAKE and that are meaningful to you (as in, you've been there, you've seen that, you've eaten it, you fell in it, you tripped over it, etc.). Great places to take pictures (especially if you are sticking around Maryville) would be Hobby Lobby, grocery stores (the produce section, the meat section), the mall (you know... weird people), the greenbelt, public buildings, the mountains, downtown Knoxville, your house, your car, you get the picture! This should be a large file of images that we will use as references for our pieces. You need at least 5 of each subject matter listed below:

- Bones, shells, skeletons, exoskeletons
- Perspective
- Portraits
- Ordinary behavior
- Action portrait
- BIG things
- Unusual interiors
- Funny things
- Satire
- Repurposed
- Skies
- Machines, gears, gadgets

You need to submit at LEAST 60 photos, any number less will be counted down on your grade. If you do not have a cell phone or camera to take these pictures with, please contact me immediately. I am so excited to go through this class with you and cannot wait to see what you come up with!
